Principal's Report

Stage 4 and 5 Examinations

This week students in stages 4 and 5 are involved in exams. These will occur in normal classes and contribute towards the Yearly Reports handed out at the end of the year.

National Partnerships Final Evaluation

The report on the use of National Partnership funding which has been coming into the school since 2009 has been sent off to Sydney. The funding has been extremely useful in the education of our students through Quicksmart, Multilit, Duke of Edinburgh, the employment of Raylene our Aboriginal School Learning Support Officer and our Attendance Officer Mrs Salter. National Partnership funding finishes at the end of 2013.

RAM – Resource Allocation Model

The manner in which schools are allocated funding is changing from the beginning of 2014. It will now be coming into the school via a Resource Allocation Model. This is determined based on the numbers of students, their background, socio economic status and the employment and education of their parents. The school will be updating this information early next year to ensure that the school is allocated the appropriate amount of money to suit the needs of its students. I have attached documentation explaining the RAM for you to learn about the new system. I will also discuss this at the next AECG and P&C Meetings.

Teacher Professional Development

Last Tuesday I attended an Empowering Local Schools National Partnership conference in Sydney where Michael Fullan was the deliverer of information relating to leading change in schools. This was extremely useful and I have already begun implementating some of the recommendations at school. This Monday I attended professional development in Dubbo relating to the new Resource Allocation Model and how to understand the funding allocated to Nyngan High School.

Mrs Murray and Raylene Weldon are attending the National Aboriginal Education Conference in Sydney this week. Our SAS staff are attending a course at Nyngan High School on Mental Health First Aid this week. Mrs Bush is Relieving as Deputy Principal in Mrs Murray's absence this week. Sandra Beetson, Bev Bush and Kyri Martin are in Dubbo training in the new computing system for finance and student management.

<u>Year 11</u>

Year 11 received their Assessment Schedule Booklets yesterday. Mr O'Neill went through the booklet with students and pointed out the Board of Studies requires principals to have evidence that a student has:

Followed the course

Applied themselves with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course by the school Achieved all or some of the course outcomes.

Students who do not do the above risk an N Determination (non-completion of course). It is very hard to do any of those things listed if you are absent more than 85% of the time so attending school every day is very important.

A reminder that during study periods students are expected to be working in the library or on their major works etc, by arrangement with their teachers and after notifying Mr Corby.

Students who do not have a class in period 1 are allowed to arrive and sign into school, via the front office at 9.45am (at the latest). Students who do not have a class in period 5 are allowed to sign out via the front office at lunchtime. Year 11 students are not required to attend sport and they have already been signing out at lunchtime on a Monday.

The Assessment Booklet will be available on our website so students can access it easily, especially the Illness/Misadventure application.

Western Deputy Principal Conference

Last Thursday and Friday I attended the Western Deputy Principal Conference at Cobar. There were sessions presented about BYOD (Bring Your Own Device), Quality Teaching, Instructional Rounds, Australian Teacher and Principal Standards, The Dubbo School of Distance Education and an association meeting. Science News

ESSA Test

A reminder that Year 8 students will be sitting the ESSA (Essential Science Skills Assessment) online test on Tuesday 12th November. As this is a computer test, students are requested to bring their own earphones or headset in order to hear the test material. School headsets will be available for any student who does not have their own.

Stage 4 Guided Research Projects

Stage 4 students have spent the last few weeks investigating the variables involved in the swinging of a pendulum. They have performed three separate experiments where they displayed their knowledge and understanding of the investigation process. They completed research relating pendulum motion to a use such as the pendulum clock where they were able to demonstrate the research skills they have been learning about. Students were given computer time to use excel spreadsheets to produce graphs to display their experimental data and they have been looking at the presentation of their findings, analysing the data and drawing conclusions about pendulums.

Well done to Stage 4 students who have actively participated in these activities. Projects are due to teachers on Wednesday. These are the same skills used to produce the Independent Research Projects in Stage 5, except students get to choose their own area for research.
