# Principals Report

Dear School Community,

In the first newsletter of the school year I asked our school community to reflect on the question: 'What Is My Role?'

As Principal, my role is to lead the school for student improvement and manage educational change. This is an aspect, as an inexperienced Principal, which I know requires strengthening through guidance from more experienced leaders. We also have a somewhat inexperienced Executive staff that requires guidance and support to become outstanding leaders in their roles.

To achieve this goal, our school has applied for and been successful in gaining a place as one of four schools in NSW to participate in a leadership development project:

# CIN Consulting/ Charles Sturt University Rural & Remote Leadership Project

In 2017, Nyngan High School (NHS) has been selected to participate in a leadership project which is jointly coordinated by CIN Consulting and Charles Sturt University. This project has an overarching theme of increasing school leadership capacity through the explicit coaching of executive staff, to lead school change for student improvement. The CIN consultants possess over 80 years of public teaching experience, many of those years in either school Principal or Director roles. These individuals are Ian Nebauer, Ian Northam and Michael Cronk.

This project is run externally from the Department of Education (DoE) and the privacy of all individuals' responses will be maintained, as at no stage will any school information be shared with the DoE from the project. All participants who are involved in the project enter any interviews and surveys of their own volition and students involved will have permission provided by their parents. Child protection requirements are met as the CIN consultants possess a Working with Children Check, as recent/active employees of the DoE.

The first step of this project is for the CIN team to conduct an 'External Eye Process', where they will gather a wealth of school information through: surveys, school-wide interviews and school documents. To complete this process there will be interviews conducted for:

- ♦ All Executive staff
- Randomly selected classroom teaching staff groups
- ♦ A volunteer staff group & Non-teaching staff group
- Randomly selected student groups from years 8, 10 & 12
- ♦ A parent/ community group

These interviews will take place on either the 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> of March. Those randomly selected for interview groups will receive a permission/ consent letter to complete. If you do not wish to provide consent for an interview, please still return this document.

Following this information gathering process, the CIN team will develop goals in-line with our school plan and spend four days per term coaching all NHS executive staff through strategies to improve their leadership of our staff, teams and school projects; to bring about improved student outcomes.

If your child has been randomly selected to participate in a student focus group interview, a consent letter will be sent home. The student groups will consist of 6-8 students from their year group, who will be asked a series of questions about the school, including:

- Does the school meet your learning expectations and needs?
- ♦ What is successful teaching and how does it help students?
- ♦ What makes a successful learning environment?

Staff and parents who are randomly selected to participate in a focus will be asked a series of questions about the school, on areas including:

- School leadership
- ♦ Effective practices of teaching staff
- ♦ School involvement for community members

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This is an outstanding opportunity to improve the educational side of our school, as we improve the physical and technological aspects this year. All enquiries and return of consent forms will be directed to the Principal and Deputy Principal.

In the coming months, this leadership project will expose any deficits and inexperience we possess as leaders of the school.

This could be frightening.

This may be difficult.

This will be worth it!!

In life we must improve ourselves first if we wish to help others improve.




# **Maths News**

On the 22nd February, Nyngan High Open Boys Cricket Team travelled to Cobar to play the first round of the Alan Davidson Shield.

The boys were fresh and keen as skipper Jak finally won a toss, putting Nyngan in to bat. Tim Walsh started positively but soon fell as he spooned one to point, Jak fell not long after. At 2 for 8 the boys were off to a shaky start but a brilliant partnership from Cale and Terrance for 43 steadied the ship. Dunny eventually going for 8. Jacob found himself in the middle at 3 for 51 and one run later Terrance got caught by an absolute screamer in the covers. With two new batters in the middle, Shone and Wherritt, Nyngan were once again in trouble. Cobar's questionable fielding gave a second life to Shone, as the boys dug in and got to drinks at 4 for 55. With a big score on the card for Nyngan the batsmen in the centre had a job to do. Knocking around the ones and twos the scoring started to come more freely. But after a partnership of 35 Wherro was caught out. Jedd went for only one and Coop found himself in the middle at 6 for 90 with about 8 overs to go. Shone and Ryan decided to put back their ears, but the slow Cobar out-field was making a boundary almost impossible to hit. In the final over Shone skied one and was caught out for 36, after putting on 41 with Coop in the last 8 overs Nyngan were in a commanding position at 7 for 131. Roy got to face the final ball, hitting a 7 (a Cobar fielder hit a water bottle with a ball) and Nyngan finished at 7 for 141. (Shone 36, T Ryan 22 and C Ryan 19 n.o.)

The boys felt confident in the field with such a lead and this confidence quickly transferred into a 4th over Jak Jeffery wicket. Striking again his very next over the Cobar batters had no answer for the Nyngan skipper. Cooper took one from his end and Jeffery once again had the Cobar batsmen in all sorts as another fell. Tyler replaced Ryan and his change quickly paid off with Marto striking in his very first over. Terrance then came on for Jak and turned Cobar batters in half, taking two quick wickets. With only three batters left, Marto decided enough was enough and took 3 wickets off 4 balls securing the 113 run victory for Nyngan. The Nyngan bowling attack proved too strong for the Cobar boys, as they scored 6 ducks! (Martin 4-6, Jak 3-6, T Ryan 2-6).

The Nyngan boys secured a comprehensive victory, as they take on Bourke in the second round at home. Come down and watch the Nyngan side make their run for the Alan Davidson Shield.
