Principal's Report

Mandatory Technology - Food Technology

What a wonderful term Mandatory Technology 1 and 4 have had cooking in the Hospitality Trade Centre!

Each practical class focused on a different cooking technique such as measuring dough for quality control for Choc Chip Cookies, trying out different pastry folding for Sausage Rolls, using a slicing technique to chiffonade a lettuce leaf for San Choy Bau, the scoop and scrape technique for Mini Chocolate Brownies, monitoring the cooking time for the perfect Chocolate Lava Cake and seeing the difference in consistency between cake mixture and muffin mixture for Blueberry Muffins.

Students were given a recipe book at the beginning of the term to put their recipes in. They will get to take them home this week as next term they will be sewing and weaving for Textiles Technology.

And so Term 3 for Maths/CAPA faculty has come to an end.

A big thankyou to everyone who helped, especially to Byron Warren and the NRL for donating the great prizes.
















