Dear School community,

In Stage 5 Music, students have finished their compositions for lyric writing and are busy ironing out the finer details for their performance piece 'Bow River'.


Visual Arts and Photography

YEAR 12 HAVE FINISHED THEIR BODY OF WORKS.... FINALLY!!!! They are in, they are marked and they are awaiting the end of the exam period to be displayed. They should all be extremely proud of themselves.

Stage 4 and 5 Visual Arts are finishing up their lino prints. Year 11 Visual Arts are working towards a mini body of work, testing out the waters ready to start Year 12 term.

Stage 5 photography have been working on their stop motion madly trying to get them finished before the end of term. Attached are some photos of them filming their scenes.

Over the last two weeks, Stage 5 students have been looking at plotting two variables in a scatter plot, and examining the strength and direction of the relationship between them. On Tuesday the students in the 5MAA class plotted average monthly temperature against average monthly rainfall for Nyngan. The plot showed that there was a strong, positive relationship between rainfall and temperature over the year. In short, summer months, while hotter, also had higher monthly rainfall, than the cooler months of the year.

Last week we were notified that they have been selected as semi-finalists in this state wide competition. Next term they will compete against other semi-finalists in the Western Region, via Zoom due to COVID. We wish them the best of luck and look forward to hearing their submission. Last year they won the people's choice award, and they are hoping to improve on that result this year!

This term we started the science club which runs every second week during lunch on Tuesdays.
